## **B. CURRICULUM FREE SUMMARY**

I studied architecture in Chile, working in parallel in an architecture office. In 1984 I traveled to Spain to take doctoral courses at the U. Politécnica de Madrid with a scholarship from the government of Spain. In my doctoral thesis (1992) he studied the relationship between the concepts of space in philosophy and the theories of architecture, topics that I have continued to develop from various perspectives. Until 1994 I combined an extensive professional work, including major works -such as the Central Plaza for the Universal Exposition of Sevilla (1992)- for which I have received various national and international awards.

In 1995 I left my professional life to dedicate myself to academy. That year I was commissioned by the Polytechnic University of Madrid School of Architecture to coordinate a Doctorate in Architecture taught at the Veracruz University in Mexico. At that time I began to investigate the understanding, configuration and management of living space.

In 1999 the University of Alcalá hired me to organize the foundation of the second Madrid School of Public Architecture, of which I was director until 2004 and then I have held various positions: Director of the Department of Architecture, Coordinator of the Doctoral Program, Commission of quality and other thistles. Since 2001 I have been a Full Professor of Architecture Analysis and it is here that I have made most of my career as a researcher, focusing on three lines of work: (1) Theory of architecture, focusing on the role of philosophical and imaginary ideas in the perception, configuration and management of living space; (2) Applied research to development cooperation, with a special emphasis on the role of tourism as an engine of development, with relevant works in sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America; (3) Analysis of the impact of tourist concepts and imagery on cities and heritage landscapes, with special interest in the social and spatial conflicts that global tourism generates, but also the study of the analysis of the opportunities that tourism provides to generate cities and spaces fairer and more creative.

In quantitative terms, I have directed or participated in 21 research projects funded in Spain, Chile, Mexico, Portugal, Angola and Canada; I have directed 6 doctoral theses, published 61 articles in scientific journals and 37 in popular journals, written 14 books as author and / or editor; participated in 73 national and 42 foreign congresses and signed 8 academic cooperation agreements.
