



Prof. Angel Asúnsolo del Barco is an associate professor at University of Alcalá (UAH – Spain) and faculty affiliates to the Department of Epidemiology & Biostatistics at Graduate School of Public Health & Health policy (City University of New York). Specialist in both preventive and legal medicine, Dr Asúnsolo studied clinical research at Harvard Medical School and management science at Pompeu i Fabra University and at IESE

Business School. He has combined these areas in his career. His interests include the use of epidemiological methods in translational clinical research and, as part of real-world practice, the use of electronic health records and administrative data to facilitate the investigation and understanding of the health of populations. His most current research is focused in chronic diseases and ongoing projects include studying the effect of 1) chronic venous insufficiency on pregnancy outcomes and 2) different outcomes (especially mental health) on the use of healthcare resources. He has been member of the governing board and permanent commission of the Spanish Public Research Consortium in Epidemiology and Public Health (CIBERESP, 2011-2013), Dean of medicine (2013-2014) and Director of academic quality at UAH (2014-2015). Currently, he is Deputy director of the Department of Surgery, Medical and Social science (2016-) and member of the Ramón y Cajal Health Research Institute (IRYCIS).
